Perennial Plants

By choosing the right plants for your garden space and light conditions, you can enjoy blooms throughout the season!

Shade tolerant plants will grow and thrive in lower light conditions. Full shade is defined as less than 4 hours of direct sun per day, whereas part sun is defined as 4-6 hours. Note that some plants are more tolerant of full shade than others, so be sure to check individual tags for specific cultural requirements.
