Perennial Plants

Plants that prefer or tolerate moist soil often grow in low-lying, seasonally flooded areas and/or deep shade. If you have regularly soggy or saturated areas in your yard, you can enhance your backyard habitat by selecting some of the many beautiful native species that thrive in these conditions!
